

Summary of TEI 2013 annual returns

Ethnicity

It is noted that not all institutions collect data according to the census classifications; some students choose not to declare ethnicity; some chose more than 1.

This geographical spread adds to 100 less than the total number of placements during 2013. The numbers did not match for 3 institutions.

463 students are reported as having completed placements in the Government sector.

DHBs, 179; CYFs 208; Corrections 48; Other Government 28. 41 of these students did not have any RSW supervision.

1288 students had placements in the NGO sector – 227 of these with iwi organisations.

Total students reported as being placed in the Government plus NGO sector is 1751 – 31 more than the total number of placements indicated as occurring during 2013. Numbers did not match for 5 institutions.

1 institution did not enter any data for supervision in the NGO sector. From the remaining 16 institutions 407 students across 8 institutions did not have either a primary or second supervisor who was a registered social worker.

I have not done a further analysis of supervision arrangements.

158 students undertook a placement in their place of employment.

55 students had a placement that broke down.

61 students failed a placement.
